

Community Wildfire Protection Plans in San Diego County

Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) are an important component of a wildfire safety strategy. These plans are developed by communities in collaboration with federal and state agencies, who can help to identify and prioritize projects and priorities.

How we support the CWPP process:

The Fire Safe Council of San Diego County supports local Fire Safe Councils, tribes, and other community groups in drafting or updating a Community Wildfire Protection Plan through:

- Annual Writer's Workshop Series
- A CWPP Template
- GIS Mapping
- Facilitating review and approval

Why develop or update a CWPP?

- In some cases, grant applications may receive greater priority if the projects are identified in an approved CWPP.
- Work to address issues specific to your community, such as: wildfire response, hazard mitigation, and community preparedness.
- Identify and prioritize areas for hazardous fuel reduction and forest health projects, and outline plans for mitigation.
- Collaborate with stakeholders in your community to identify and clarify priorities for protection of life, property, and critical infrastructure.

These documents are signed and approved by a CWPP review committee, local fire agency, and the CAL FIRE Unit Chief.
