Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) are an important component of a wildfire safety strategy. These plans are developed by communities in collaboration with federal and state agencies, who can help to identify and prioritize projects and priorities. During this workshop, you will work with subject matter experts to learn about utilizing the CWPP template, gathering community input, the importance of GIS mapping, and additional topics which can aid in drafting or updating your plan. The review and signature process will be explained, and you can expect to gain contacts who will aid you in this process.

Why develop or update a CWPP?

- In some cases, grant applications may receive greater priority if the projects are identified in an approved CWPP
- Work to address issues specific to your community, such as: wildfire response, hazard mitigation, and community preparedness
- Identify and prioritize areas for hazardous fuel reduction and forest health projects, and outline plans for mitigation
- Collaborate with stakeholders in your community to identify and clarify priorities for protection of life, property, and critical infrastructure.
